

estled at the head of the Damariscotta River, a small historic harbor is the centerpiece of the twin villages of Newcastle and Damariscotta. Dating back nearly three hundred years, this community is one of the earliest fishing centers on the Maine coast. Lincoln Academy founded in 1801 shares an equally proud history. It is one of the oldest continuously running Academies in the United States and has served this region proudly for 218 years. Lincoln is situated just an hour from Portland, the largest city in Maine and just over two hours from Boston, the hub of New England.





Week 1

<u>Day 12:</u> Morning ESL. Create skits with ESL groups <u>Day 13:</u> Morning ESL. Visit Boothbay Harbor, for whale and puffin watching

Day 14: Morning ESL, perform skits after dinner, enjoy an ice cream sundae party.

<u>Day 17:</u> Travel to Boston: tour Harvard, MIT Fanueil hall and North Market


